16th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B II) Psalter Week 4

THE ANNOUNCER!

The Lord our Shepherd is compassion and love. Today's readings draw our attention to the image of our Lord being the compassionate shepherd who leads with justice, reconciles, and cares deeply for the needs of the people.

In the first reading from the prophet Jeremiah, God gave a stern warning against the leaders of the people of Israel who were unfaithful shepherds to the people by not looking after them and scattering them. God promised to take care of his people himself. He will do that when He raises a virtuous branch from David's line, a shepherd and king who will rule with wisdom, honesty and integrity, who will gather God's flock wherever they had been scattered to safety – a shepherd who will care for their welfare.

In the second reading, Paul writing to the Ephesians speaks of how Jesus, through His sacrifice, breaks down the walls of hostility that divide people. People who are far from God have been brought closer to Him. Jesus creates one new humanity, making peace and reconciling everyone to God through the cross. Isn't that the image of the shepherd who gathers the scattered children of God? Jesus is the shepherd and saviour who has reconciled God's children to God.

In the Gospel of Mark, we see how much Jesus cared for his disciples when they needed rest after returning from their mission and how He cared for the people hungry for the word of God. He took the disciples to a 'lonely place', out on the sea, where they would rest and, at the shore, He cared for the people who had gathered yearning for God like a sheep without a shepherd. He became their shepherd and taught them at some length. Jesus' compassion was outstanding.

As we meditate on Christ's compassion, let us also reflect on our roles as leaders and followers of Christ. We are invited to care for and lead those under our authority with justice and integrity. We are invited to contribute our part towards uniting God's flock scattered all over the world, to reconcile those in enmity, to practice compassion like Jesus and bring the lasting peace of Him, the good shepherd – the peace that leads to the green pasture where goodness and mercy abide with us forever.
