## 20th October 2024 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B II) Psalter Week 1

## THE ANNOUNCER!

Today's readings invite us Christians to follow Christ's path of self-sacrifice, compassion, humility and sympathy for those suffering. It is an invitation to embrace the path of suffering in our journey of faith through which we pass to the glory of heaven.

The first reading tells us about the path of the suffering servant of God, whom God allowed to be crushed with suffering but through whom the will of God is done. His suffering was to justify many people by taking their sins on himself. The prophecy pointed to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, by whose suffering on the Cross we have been redeemed. His path of suffering is not a punishment but a redemptive act, for by His wounds, we have been healed.

The second reading then speaks of Christ as our compassionate high priest. He has come from great heights to us, He is not distant from our struggles. So, He understands our weaknesses because He feels with us, He knows our weaknesses as He was one like us, though He did not sin. We are invited to approach His throne of mercy confidently when we need help.

In the gospel according to Mark, the two brothers James and John had come to Jesus asking for a favour - to be allowed to sit at his right and left in his glory. It was a request for a position of power and authority. At that time, they had not understood what it meant to be a disciple of Christ and more still to be a leader after Christ. Christ, who understands us, seeing through their naivety told them they had no idea what they were asking. He used the opportunity to teach them and all the disciples that true greatness is found in serving others, even to the point of becoming a slave and giving one's life for them.

Let us remember that the path of suffering and service is where Jesus calls us to follow. It is not an easy road, but it surely leads to eternal life. Our mission is to serve, give of ourselves, and trust that God will bring redemption through our sacrifices. Let us confidently approach Him, knowing that He, our compassionate high priest, will offer us the necessary grace to live out this call. Amen.
