THE ANNOUNCER!

The Easter season is a time of renewal, love and hope. Today's readings call us to meditate on the renewal going on in the Church and world – it is a call to see how God is working in our time to renew us in love while we are facing the trials of our time – there is the message of new Churches, new heaven and earth and new commandment.

The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells us about the achievements and successes of the first missionary journey of Paul and Barnabas. They returned to the communities where they had preached, consolidated their faith and appointed elders for the communities. Finally, they returned to the community where they received their commission by the Holy Spirit in Antioch to give an account of their ministry.

In the second reading from the book of Revelation, John saw a vision of the new heaven and earth after a time of trial and distress. The image of a new heaven and earth is the coming together of the two realms, the holy city of God and the new Jerusalem coming down on the earth to be with people. God is coming to be with His people everywhere on earth. God's Kingdom will certainly come to us after our struggles in life.

In the gospel reading according to John, while Judas, who had evil in his heart, had gone away to plot with the Jews who would arrest Jesus, Jesus spoke to the rest of the disciples about His glory and the glorification of the Father in what would happen to Him. More importantly, He gave the disciples a new commandment of love: "Just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another." People will recognise them due to the love they have in them.

We have the Christian calling to strengthen one another like Paul and Barnabas did for the nascent Churches in their ministry. We are called to carry love in us always, and with it we can be identified, with it we can build the body of Christ everywhere in the world, making God's kingdom come on earth. Let us hope in the God who is making all things new and who calls us to share in his mission of renewing the earth with His love.
