## THE ANNOUNCER!

We are invited to reflect today on our Christian mission. We find the theme of our being called and sent by God in the readings. How would we know it is God calling us for his mission? We would feel His awesome presence and impulse in and around us, drawing us to answer his call like the prophet Isaiah, St. Paul, and Simon Peter in the readings, and would feel our unworthiness except for the grace of God in us.

In the first reading, Isaiah had a vision of God's glory, surrounded by angels crying out, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts!" Confronted with such holiness, Isaiah acknowledged his sinfulness before God. God sent his angel who purified him, and then God called him to be His prophet, which Isaiah accepted, responding, "Here I am! Send me". Like Isaiah, we are purified when we recognise our sinfulness before God and He sends us forth to bring His holiness to the world.

Similarly, St. Paul, in the second reading, acknowledged his unworthiness as an Apostle of Christ, calling himself the least of them because he once persecuted the Church. It was only through divine grace that he became a powerful witness to Christ. God's grace makes all the difference.

In the gospel according to Luke, we are presented with the story of the call of Simon Peter. Was it by chance, a coincidence, or a divine plan that Jesus would meet Peter there by the sea, and his fishing partners, James and John? They made no catch of fish all night. After getting into Simon's boat and preaching from there, Jesus told him to cast his nets again. This time, he made a miraculous catch that left him gobsmacked. It was only God's handwork and Simon felt his unworthiness before Jesus. At that moment, Jesus called him to be a fisher of people for God.

As God is calling us through different means, displaying his holiness to us and purifying us for his mission, he reminds us that He does not call the perfect, but He perfects those He calls. He doesn't count our sins and weaknesses but pardons us. And when we acknowledge them, His grace will convert them to strength for God's mission. Fr Kingsley


**Weekday Mass:** The weekday Mass will be on Fridays at 9.30am in the house, preceded by Exposition and Confessions.
