## THE ANNOUNCER!

The word of God invites us to reflect on love, mercy and restraint in times of temptation to vengeance. It is the love that holds no grudge, refrains from revenge and pardons iniquity. Isn't that the type of love the world needs especially in our time? We have an invitation today to assume that new love self, which is different from a vengeful self.

In the first reading, we heard the story of David and Saul. It was a tale of mercy, which transcends every feeling of revenge. King Saul had sought to kill David for a long time. Ordinarily, the principle that people would apply would be self-defence and an eye for an eye. But when David had the opportunity to strike down King Saul, he chose not to harm him - the Lord's anointed. He applied restraint and trusted in God's justice rather than taking laws into his hands.

In the second reading, St. Paul expounds on the contrast between the first Adam (who was earthly and brought death) and Christ the "last Adam" (who is heavenly and life-giving). He reminds us as followers of Christ, that we have been given a new nature through His resurrection. We are no longer merely of the earth but heavenly after the image of Christ. This message reminds us also that we are called to assume Christ's nature and love. The love that forgives sin and hurts against us.

In the gospel reading, Jesus teaches us to love our enemies, to do good to those who hate us, to bless those who curse us, and to give without expecting anything in return. This is not an easy calling—it goes against our human instincts. However, that is why Jesus took flesh—to teach us that it is possible to love in that way. That is why on the cross, He prayed for His enemies. His love is not conditional or transactional; it is selfless.

This radical and selfless love and mercy is essential for a lasting peace on earth. David tried to live by it in his experience with King Saul. Jesus did the same to those who crucified Him when He asked the Father to forgive them. When we have the urge to revenge, let us learn the virtue of restraint, mercy and love.

Conditions for Obtaining the Jubilee Indulgence During the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, all the faithful, who are truly repentant and free from any affection for sin who are moved by a spirit of charity and who, during the Holy Year, purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, (this prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the individual, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested), will be able to obtain from the treasury of the church a plenary indulgence, with remission and forgiveness of all their sins, if they also undertake a pious pilgrimage or a pious visit to any sacred jubilee site. This Jubilee Plenary Indulgence can be also applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory.
