THE ANNOUNCER!

This Sunday, we celebrate the solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. It underscores the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist, His Body, His Blood, His Soul, and His Divinity. We celebrate the divine gift of love so great that it sustains and unites us in a bond stronger than any earthly connection. Today's readings invite us to open our hearts to this mystery. In the First Reading, Melchizedek, king of Salem and priest of God Most High, offers bread and wine to Abraham and blesses him. This gesture foreshadows the Eucharist, where bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ. God's provision and covenant are rooted in divine hospitality and blessing, which are a sign of His eternal care for His children. Abraham received this blessing with gratitude and trust, just as God calls us to His loving provision and invites us to respond with reverence and faith.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul's words deepen our understanding of the Eucharist as a participation in Christ's sacrifice. "Do this in remembrance of me." These words resound through time and remain central to our Catholic doctrine, discipline, and devotion. The Eucharist is both a commemoration and communion. It is an encounter with the living Christ who offers His very self to us. Partaking of the Eucharist is an act of love which unites us in Christ's body, transforms us and calls us to love others as He has loved us.

In the Gospel, the feeding of the five thousand reveals the compassion of Jesus. He takes the little that is offered and creates abundance. This is the miracle of multiplication where our Lord turns scarcity into sufficiency, loneliness into fellowship, and despair into hope. It speaks of divine provision and God's ability to nourish our bodies and souls. We must trust in God's power to fulfil our deepest needs through the gift of the Eucharist.

In the Eucharist, we celebrate the true and real presence of Christ. This sacrament is the culmination of God's saving plan, a divine meal where bread and wine become His very self, given out of love. When we go to Holy Communion, let us recognise that it is Christ Himself whom we receive. As recipients of the Eucharistic love, should we not become Christ's hands and feet, bringing His love where it is most needed? **Fr. Peter**
