THE ANNOUNCER!

The Spirit speaks in more than words

Recently, I had the blessing of visiting Rome and Southern Italy. It became a pilgrimage of the heart as much as one of geography. In Rome, the Eternal City, I was struck by the immense gathering of peoples: pilgrims from every corner of the world converging on sacred places, their footsteps reverberating centuries of faith. The basilicas overflowed with devotion, and the sense of the universal Church was overwhelming. In Southern Italy, I encountered a different but equally powerful expression of faith: vibrant, familial, joy-filled communities where the faith is lived as something both ancient and modern. The churches there sang with life—an enthusiasm passed from generation to generation.

Amid all the beauty, I also faced the challenge of language. Often, I found myself at a loss for words, struggling to follow homilies preached in unfamiliar tongues. I concelebrated Masses, reading the Eucharistic prayers in Italian—not fully understanding the words, yet somehow being understood by the people. There were moments when I felt like a stranger: unable to speak, yet deeply present. Still, even when words failed, the language of faith did not. A sign of the cross, a shared "Amen," or the reverent silence during the consecration—these spoke louder than any words. It was in these moments that Pentecost came alive for me.

On Pentecost, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles, as recounted in the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. The Spirit descended like tongues of fire, and suddenly, the apostles began to speak in different languages, languages they had never learned. And yet, all who heard them understood them in their tongues. What a miracle: the breaking of linguistic barriers, the birth of a Church that is one and yet many.

My own experience of the language barrier now feels like a small taste of the longing that existed before Pentecost—a longing for communion, connection, understanding, and, ultimately, faith that speaks a single language, the language of love. In our world, 'differences in language' can still divide us. But Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit transcends these divisions. What I could not express in words during my visit abroad, I often found expressed in gestures of kindness, in the universal rhythm of the Mass, and in the gaze and smile of a fellow pilgrim or believer. The Spirit speaks in more than words. How then can I become more attentive to the ways the Holy Spirit speaks beyond words in everyday life?

The month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and this year we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus on Friday 27th June.

Sometimes we look around and see the gaps where people used to worship beside us, so it's good to know there is growth in the Church. We pray for growth in our own parish, in numbers and in Faith.
